<a href="#"><u>30 Foot Drop</u></a>			<p><b>Realities and Advantages of Access and Inclusion</b></p> <p>Barriers will be identified that people with a disability, their families and carers face when accessing services. This ranges from the front-line staff who are uncomfortable serving a person with a disability, to the executives of the same organisation who approve policies, procedures and employment practices that may create barriers for people with disability.</p> <p>The two-pronged strategy will target the front-line staff to give them the strategies they need to interact with people with a disability and equip the executives with the knowledge they require to make the most of the opportunity that people with a disability represent.</p>	South West
<a href="#"><u>Befriend</u></a>			<p><b>Befriend Social Scale-Up Readiness Project: Growing an inclusive, connected WA</b></p> <p>The Befriend Social Scale-Up Readiness Project will expand the Befriend Social Network across the South-East Perth Metropolitan area. The social network links people with disability to a range of individuals and communities and increases peoples' participation in local events.</p> <p>An accessible multimedia Toolkit and online system will be developed and tested so that any lessons learned can benefit regional WA</p>	Perth Metro
<a href="#"><u>Cahoots (Kids' Camps Inc)</u></a>		Young People	<p><b>Cahoots Social Rec Club for young people living with disability</b></p> <p>Private and community-based recreation, leisure and entertainment centres will be targeted to improve their ability to provide inclusive and accessible services for people with disability. A disability action and inclusion working group will be formed that includes people with disability and family/carers to guide the development of inclusion training that will be delivered to staff working at the centres.</p>	Perth Metro

Existing resources will be utilised, and new resources developed where required. Information sessions will be developed and delivered in consultation with people with disability and their families who have had experience in accessing NDIS to ensure that private enterprises and community organisations get an understanding of the needs of people with disability. An e-learning train the trainer package will also be developed to support the workforce of the participating enterprises and organisations.</p>	State-wide
<a href="#"><u>Down Syndrome Association of WA</u></a>		Intellectual Disability	<p><b>Online Platform: Easy steps to include people with intellectual disability in small business and community organisations</b></p> <p>A community education and development program will enhance the knowledge, skills and capability of service providers in disability, mainstream and community services to support people with Down syndrome and facilitate inclusion. Resources will be developed for employees who have Down Syndrome to help develop skills, knowledge, capacity and resilience. Resources for employers will be developed to assist them in becoming more accessible and inclusive for people with disability.</p>	State-wide (online)

			People with Down Syndrome will co-develop and be part of resource development and training through the Down Syndrome Ambassador Programme, receiving mentoring support to speak at training and events for community organisations.	
<a href="#">Far North Community Services Ltd</a>		Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander	<p><b>Localised Inclusion Project</b></p> <p>Inclusion Coordinators will become key liaison points in each sub region of Broome, Derby, Fitzroy Crossing, Halls Creek and Kununurra. The focus is on supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people with disability. The Inclusion Coordinators will support people with disability at an individual level to participate in community activities and events, whilst also working with community groups at a systemic level to build capacity to ensure access for all people with disability.</p> <p>A social media site will be developed to promote good news stories of people with disability in the Kimberley living a good life.</p>	Kimberley
<a href="#">Inclusion WA</a>		Young People	<p><b>Building capacity of WA communities</b></p> <p>A partnership will be developed with Youth Disability Advocacy Network (YDAN), Aboriginal Insights and three Local Government Authorities (LGAs). Resources will be developed to assist LGAs and other key stakeholders in communities to be more inclusive of people with disability.</p>	State-wide
<a href="#">Inclusion Solutions</a>			<p><b>Community Training &amp; Club Mentoring</b></p> <p>Inclusion Solutions will provide a personalised mentoring service to eight local government authorities (five metro and three regional) to build the capacity and skills of their staff.</p> <p>Thirty-two community groups within eight geographical locations will be provided with training which will include Disability Awareness, Social Inclusion, Inclusive Events, Recreation Opportunities, and Community Inclusion.</p>	State-wide
<a href="#">Leadership WA</a>			<p><b>Regional LeadAbility Program</b></p> <p>Regional LeadAbility Program will be designed to provide a series of experiences introducing people with disability and workers in the disability sector to empowering concepts of leadership, with a focus on delivering positive outcomes in regional WA.</p> <p>Through the provision of a leadership course, the project will aim to increase private enterprise and community-based organisational capability to engage successfully with people with disabilities, their families and carers. A Regional LeadAbility Community of Practice will be developed to ensure ongoing collaboration, learning and peer support.</p>	Great Southern Perth Metro Pilbara South West
<a href="#">MIFWA (Mental Illness Fellowship of WA)</a>		Psychosocial Disability	<p><b>Peer Based Education</b></p> <p>Workplace lunch box presentations (taster workshops) about mental illness and recovery will be delivered by trained facilitators, including families and carers with their own lived experience to businesses, community organisations and local government. Workshop attendees will be assisted to develop a 'toolbox' of strategies of how they can support recovery and welcome people with psychosocial disability.</p>	Perth Metro Wheatbelt

<a href="#">Peel Volunteer Resource Centre</a>		Young People	<p><b>SocialAbility Program</b></p> <p>A new SocialAbility Programme will be designed to promote and actively provide opportunities for people with and without disability to participate in volunteer roles, meet other people and raise awareness of the valued contribution that people of all abilities can provide as volunteers.</p> <p>The programme will facilitate connection between participating volunteers and Volunteer Involving Organisations (VIOs). Ongoing support will be provided to build the skills, knowledge and confidence of the volunteer participants, and support VIOs to develop inclusive practices.</p>	Perth Metro
<a href="#">Valued Lives Foundation</a>			<p><b>Micro-enterprise Hubs Project - Connecting people with their communities through work.</b></p> <p>The Micro-Enterprise Hubs Project will support people with disability to pursue their goals of social and economic participation.
